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Core Element 1: Agency Profile, Goals, and Strategies

Agency profile: Blue Ridge Opportunity Commission Inc. (BROC) is a 501 (c) (3) non-profit organization established in 1966 as a Community Action Agency. BROC serves Alleghany, Ashe and Wilkes counties, with a mission to provide assistance and services to low-income families, enabling them to move out of poverty. Alleghany and Ashe Counties are located in the northwestern mountains of North Carolina, while Wilkes County is located in the foothills. All three counties are rural locations.

The BROC Head Start program promotes early childhood education by delivering a comprehensive high-quality, school readiness curriculum to support the educational, nutritional, health, social and emotional needs of low-income children, ages 3 – 5, and their families. BROC Head Start services are family-oriented, following the belief that parents are the primary educators and nurturers of their children. Families are encouraged to become self-sufficient with assistance from the Head Start staff. Children with disabilities are integrated into the classrooms, and receive any necessary therapies and services, which usually are coordinated with the public schools. Nutritious breakfasts, lunches, and snacks are served daily. For the current year (7-1-2013 to 6-30-2014), BROC Head Start is funded to serve 136 children. In Alleghany County, Gap Civil Head Start enrolls 17 children, and Sizemore Head Start, in Ashe County, serves 17 children. In Wilkes County, Cub Creek Head Start enrolls 68 children, Lomax enrolls 17 children, and North Wilkesboro enrolls 17 children.

BROC Head Start is allotted NC Pre-K slots from the North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services. The mission of the NC Pre-K Program is to ensure school success for at-risk children in North Carolina through high-quality pre-kindergarten experiences. Comparable to Head Start Programs, child care providers that participate in the NC Pre-K Program are required to meet high quality standards, which are built on the premise that in order to be successful academically in school, children need to be prepared in all five of the major domains of development, which are health and physical development, social and emotional development, language development and communication, cognition and general knowledge, and approaches toward learning.

Alleghany County: Gap Civil Head Start is the only Head Start center in this county. The center is licensed for a capacity of fifty (50) children and has two classrooms. Gap Civil has a five star rating-the highest rating from the North Carolina's Star Rated License System. The center is located in Sparta, the county seat, and provides enrollment opportunities for the entire county. Gap Civil Head Start Center is a modular unit that was purchased in 1994 by Blue Ridge Opportunity Commission, Inc. Alleghany County is a leading Christmas tree grower in the state.

Ashe County: Sizemore Head Start is the only Head Start center in this county. The center is licensed for a capacity of sixty (60) children and has three classrooms. Sizemore has a five star rating; the highest rating from the North Carolina's Star Rated License System. Currently, this center is allotted fifteen (15) NC Pre-K slots. The center is located in Jefferson, the county seat, and provides enrollment opportunities for the entire county. Sizemore Head Start Center is a modular unit that was purchased in 1994 by Blue Ridge Opportunity Commission, Inc. Ashe County is a leading Christmas tree grower in the state.

<u>Wilkes County</u>: Wilkes County is the largest county in the BROC service area. Wilkes County is known as the birthplace of Holly Farms, now Tyson Farms, Inc. and Lowes Companies, Inc. and in recent years has become a tourist attraction area due to arts and cultural community activities. There are three (3) Head Start centers within the county.

Cub Creek Head Start – The center is licensed for a capacity of seventy-seven (77) children and has four classrooms. Cub Creek has a five star rating-the highest rating from the North Carolina's Star Rated License System. The center is located in Wilkesboro, the county seat, and provides enrollment opportunities for many parts of the county. Three of the classrooms are part of a modular unit that was purchased in 1991, and the fourth classroom was purchased by Blue Ridge Opportunity Commission, Inc in 2007.

Lomax Head Start – The center is licensed for a capacity of twenty (20) children and has one classroom. Lomax has a five star rating-the highest rating from the North Carolina's Star Rated License System. The

center is located in Roaring River and provides enrollment opportunities for the eastern part of the county. Lomax Head Start opened in 1993 and is housed in a converted community center building.

North Wilkesboro Head Start — The center is licensed for a capacity of thirty-three (33) children and has one classroom. North Wilkesboro has a five star rating-the highest rating from the North Carolina's Star Rated License System. The center is located in North Wilkesboro and provides enrollment opportunities for North Wilkesboro and other parts of the county. The North Wilkesboro Head Start center was purchased in 1994 by Blue Ridge Opportunity Commission, Inc.

Core Element II: Professional Development:

BROC Head Start utilizes technology to support its work through a child management system, in this case, the ChildPlus.net database program. ChildPlus.net is a complete Head Start management solution with features such as: Head Start tracking, Audit log, Director's Dashboard, LiveLetter, Live Report, Application, Maps, Reports, Organizer, Navigation, Web Based Training, Professional Development, plus many more features. This technology gives teachers, the Education Manager and other Head Start staff access to a comprehensive set of data and reports on each child's educational and developmental process. All of these applications are designed to improve on-going monitoring and child outcomes that will ensure an improved educational environment and learning experience for children.

BROC Head Start is currently using Teaching Strategies Gold, an online assessment tool available to teachers. Data input by teachers can be accessed by parents pertinent to their child. Lesson plans are developed and downloaded by

teachers and managers through this program. It also allows teachers to research pertinent activities that can be incorporated with their lesson plans. All teachers have been trained and certified in the utilization of this program.

The IT Manager is responsible for recording all Professional Development training into the ChildPlus database. Documentation of training and sign-in sheets is filed in the Professional Development Manager's office, located at the BROC Head Start Central office.

All administrative staff checks email several times daily; center staff is required to check email at least once daily.

Core Element IV: Evaluation and Monitoring

The BROC Head Start IT Specialist will monitor and evaluate installation and will be responsible for documenting and analyzing the evaluation process regularly to determine if goals are being met. The IT Specialist monitors and archives e-mail messages and websites as a part of ensuring compliance with applicable laws, and regulations. BROC Head Start's Technology Plan will be evaluated annually by a Technology Committee to determine that the technology plan implemented is effective in achieving organization's objectives. Upon review, the committee may make mid-course modifications if needed, to take advantage of new opportunities that become available.

All hardware equipment and software programs will be maintained by the BROC Head Start IT Specialist, or by the Technical Support Specialist, from Computer Scope, Inc.

The Head Start Director, Fiscal Manager and IT Specialist will monitor cost of this project. All changes to this project must be approved by the Head Start Director in writing.

Children's Internet Protection Act (CIPA)

- 1. Technology protection measure: The term "technology protection measure" means a specific technology that blocks or filters Internet access to visual depictions that are:
 - a. Obscene
 - b. Child pornography
 - c. Harmful to minors—the term 'minor' means any individual who has not attained the age of 17 years. The term "harmful to minors' means any picture, image, graphic image file, or other visual depiction that: (A) taken as a whole and with respect to minors, appeals to a prurient interest in nudity, sex, or excretion; (B) depicts, describes, or represents, in a patently offensive way with respect to what is suitable for minor, an actual or simulated sexual act or sexual contact, actual or simulated normal or perverted sexual act, or a lewd exhibition of the genitals; and (C) taken as a whole, lacks serious literary, artistic, political, or scientific value as to minors.

BROC Head Start uses the Windows Live Family Safety web filtering technology to help determine which categories of content the children can view.

Categories that the Family Safety assigns to websites:

- Child-friendly website: Websites that contain content that is understandable and usable by children and is appropriate for them. The language is aimed at children who are reading at grade-school level, and the concepts presented can be understood by younger minds. (Head Start children will be allowed access to Child-Friendly websites)
- Social networking websites: Websites that provide social networking or web-based chat as the main
 feature or function. These websites are designed to help you stay in touch with friends and meet new
 people through the Internet. This category doesn't include programs like Windows Live Messenger that
 let you send instant messages to people. (Head Start children will not be allowed access to Social
 networking websites)
- Web mail: Websites that provide online email services that aren't associated with an Internet provider, business, school, or other institution, and that don't require membership, services, or transactions. This category doesn't include programs that support web mail, such as Microsoft Outlook. (Head Start children will not be allowed access to Web mail websites)
- Anonymizer websites: Websites that help conceal your identity on the Internet. (Head Start children will not be allowed access to Anonymizer websites)
- Adult content: Websites that contain sexually graphic or explicit material are considered to be adult content. This category doesn't include websites about sexual education such as information on reproduction and sexual development, sexually transmitted diseases, contraception, safer sexual

practices, sexuality, or sexual orientation. (Head Start children <u>will not</u> be allowed access to Adult websites)

Websites that Family Safety haven't categorized or can't evaluate: Websites that haven't been
categorized yet or that don't have enough information for the web content filtering system to give them
a rating. (Head Start children will not be allowed access to websites that haven't been categorized or
evaluated)

The Head Start Director and IT Specialist will use the activity reports to monitor the children's Internet activities and will customize the child safety setting accordingly. Teachers will supervise each child's use of computers at all times.

2. Internet Safety Policy:

Attached as Addendum A and incorporated herein by reference is the "Technology Contract" which must be signed by all BROC Head Start employees annually. Our Internet Safety Policy is assimilated into the Technology Contract.

ADDENDUM A

BROC HEAD START

EMPLOYEE TECHNOLOGY CONTRACT

The Internet provides a unique opportunity to enhance learning styles, and meet the educational goals of the BROC Head Start Program Performance Standards. Through the Internet, teachers can interact with others on a variety of subjects, and acquire access to current, varied, and in-depth information. The Internet should be used in teaching and in meeting the educational goals of the Head Start children.

Inappropriate use of the Internet may result in limitation or cancellation of user privileges and appropriate disciplinary action. Users of the Internet must comply with the following requirements.

Definition: The term "minor" is defined as it is defined in the Children's Internet Protection Act (CIPA) statute: any individual who has not attained the age of 17 years.

- The Internet is provided for Head Start purposes only. No right of privacy exists in any communication on the Internet. The IT Specialist monitors and archives e-mail messages and websites as a part of ensuring compliance with, applicable laws, and regulations.
- Staff must meet all standards of expected online behavior and comply with all applicable laws, and regulations.
- All staff will promote ethical use of technology.
- No person may use Head Start equipment, software, or school email for personal gain, profit, or to promote a political position. BROC Head Start does not support the advertisement of any product or the promotion of any political agenda.
- Users of the Internet or other electronic communications:
 - o may not access inappropriate online materials harmful to minors;
 - may <u>not</u> engage in creating, soliciting, transmitting obscene, vulgar images or documents;
 - may not participate in defamatory, fraudulent, pornographic, harassing, cyber-bullying;
 - o may not transmit or post messages with derogatory or inflammatory remarks concerning religion, ethnicity, national origin, sexual preference, etc. about an individual or group.
 - are prohibited from unauthorized access, including hacking and other unlawful activities
 - are prohibited from unauthorized disclosure, use and dissemination of personal information regarding minors and Head Start staff.
- Specific technology that blocks or filters Internet access can be disabled for adults engaged in bona fide research or other lawful purposes
- Users will not create or transmit chain letters via e-mail.
- Teachers, or other authorized center staff or administrative personnel, will supervise a minor's use of computers and other technologies at all times, i.e.
 - o Prohibiting access by minors to inappropriate matter on the Internet.
 - Ensuring the safety and security of minors when using electronic mail, chat rooms and other forms of direct electronic communication.
 - o Prohibiting unauthorized access by minors, including so-called "hacking", and other unlawful activities
- Accessing programs and websites not appropriate for educational use are prohibited. Staff will not participate in Internet instant message activities, visit chat rooms, access personal e-mail accounts (or participate in any activity

that may cause harm to themselves or others. This includes revealing personal information).

- Users will not attempt to gain unauthorized access to programs, websites, network file space, or computer
 equipment. Attempting to disable or circumvent system filtering software is prohibited. Promoting, advocating, or
 participating in hacking is strictly prohibited.
- Users will not maliciously attempt to harm or destroy hardware, software, data, or transmit computer viruses or other malware.
- Passwords are not to be shared with anyone or posted in a conspicuous location. Users will not attempt to log in to any system or software using credentials other than their own.
- Users will not change settings on school equipment unless authorized by the Head Start Director or IT Specialist.
- Disrupting the network is prohibited.
- Users will not download or upload software or files unless authorized by the Head Start Director or IT Specialist.
- Users will not save to the network in unauthorized locations.
- I understand that measures have been put in place to restrict minors' access to harmful materials; and that an
 authorized person may disable the blocking or filtering measure during use by an adult to enable access for bona
 fide research or other lawful purposes.

Confidential student information will be handled according to the guidelines set forth by the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) and the Children's Internet Protection Act (CIPA). If sensitive electronic data is housed online or electronically, great care will be taken to prohibit unauthorized viewing, editing or duplication of files electronically or otherwise.

CONSEQUENCES: Employee offenses will result in one or more of the following at the discretion of the Head Start Director, with consultation being made with Personnel Committees.

- Private consultation with the Head Start Director
- Letter of reprimand placed in personnel folder
- Financial compensation for damages
- Limitation or loss of user privileges
- Any other disciplinary action deemed appropriate by Head Start Director
- Appropriate authorities will be notified of illegal activities
- For any act of staff vandalism, appropriate disciplinary action will be taken. Appropriate law enforcement authorities may be notified. Staff will be held financially responsible for damage, repair or replacement costs.

I understand this **EMPLOYEE TECHNOLOGY CONTRACT** applies to me. I have read and will abide by its terms and conditions. I further understand any violation of these regulations is unethical and may constitute a criminal offense or violation of BROC policy. Should I commit any violation, I will be held financially responsible; my access privileges may be revoked and appropriate disciplinary and legal action may be taken.
